Baby Changing Table

Baby changing tables are a wonderful - yet expensive - addition to any nursery. With that in mind we set about building a baby changing table that would provide a strong combination of practicality and price. The resulting table has subsequently been "battle-tested" for the past month and has stood up to the demands of both mother and



baby. Even better, when your baby (finally) outgrows the need for diapers, the changing table can be used as a children's chest of drawers. Note that the baby changing table does not have a rail around the top. Instead, it is designed to accommodate one of the standard curved foam changing pads.

Construction

Tools required: router, drill, sander

Wood required: pine and plywood





1. Prepare front frame pieces (left side)

Firstly, cut lap joints that are 1 1/2" in from each end into the two top pieces (long and short), the middle drawer pieces (two long, one short) and the base plank. Next, cut a slot out of the base plank 13" from the right and 29 1/2" from the left (hence, 4 1/2" wide). Note that when deciding which end is the right and left of this plank, lie the plank flat on the ground with the cut out lap joint part facing upwards (see diagram).





Now that all of the horizontal pieces are prepared, we need to prepare the vertical planks. Firstly, take one of the two shorter vertical pieces and nominate it as the left vertical. Cut out grooves that are 3/8" deep and 1 1/2" in (matching the cut on the horizontal pieces) at the following positions from the bottom:

- Bottom to 2 1/4" high
- 10 3/4" to 13"
- 20 1/2" to 22 3/4"
- 29 3/4" to top

Next, take the second small vertical and nominate it as the middle-right vertical. Make a mirror image of the above grooves in this piece, so that the horizontal planks will slot in. The one difference is that the base to 2 1/4" high cut should be made as a lap joint (i.e. all the way across the wood, rather than just 1 1/2" in) in order to slot into the middle groove cut out of the base plank.

2. Prepare front frame pieces (left side)

Now take one of the two longer vertical planks and nominate it as the right vertical. Cut out grooves that are 3/8" deep and 1 1/2" in (matching the cut on the horizontal pieces) at the following positions from the bottom:


- Bottom to 2 1/4" high
- 17 1/2" to 19 3/4"
- 33 1/4" to top

Next, take the second long vertical and nominate it as the middle-left vertical. Make a mirror image of the above grooves in this piece, so that the horizontal planks will slot in. The one difference is that the base-to-2 1/4" high cut should be made as a lap joint (i.e. all the way across the wood, rather than just 1 1/2" in) in order to slot into the middle groove cut out of the base plank.

Finally, take the middle-right and taller middle-left planks and glue them together, side by side. To make this joint use either dowel joints or biscuits. The result should be a double width piece that has one side taller than the other. Not that when looking at this piece from the front, it should look like one solid piece - the grooves should be in the back, not the front.

3. Glue front frame together


Once the middle, double plank has dried, it is time to connect the rest of the front together. Glue and screw the pieces together, ensuring that the finished frame is square. To help build a solid frame, clamp overnight to ensure a strong bond.



4. Prepare back frame

The back frame is relatively simple to construct as it consists only of an outer frame. Repeat step 2, but omit the horizontal planks that define the drawer spaces (but include the inner-left and inner-right vertical planks that are glued together as on the front). One prepared, glue the pieces together (as with the front). Again, ensure that the frame is square.

5. Build left (small) side panel



Take the two vertical side pieces and cut lap joints into them, and matching lap joints in the two small horizontal pieces. By so doing, the four pieces should fit together into a rectangular frame (see diagram). Next, rout out a groove on the inner, back edge of all four pieces. This groove should cut in 1/2" and be 1/2" deep. By making this groove all the way around the inside edge, the plywood sheet that forms the side panel can rest in place. Once routed, glue and screw the four side planks together - making sure the joints are square - and then glue the plywood panel into place

in the center (which will help strengthen the unit.

6. Build right (larger) side frame

Repeat step 5 for the right hand panel. Remember that this panel is larger due to the fact that the right side of the front frame is also taller.

7. Build main frame

Now that the two sides, front and back have been built, it is time to put them together. Sandwich the left hand side panel between the front and back panels and screw the three pieces together by driving screws through the front frame into the side as well as from the back frame into the side panel. Then attach the right hand panel to complete the frame. Make sure that the completed frame is square.

8. Add middle panel

Next, add the small middle panel, gluing and screwing it into place. This panel should fill the small void at the point where the front/back steps up from the lower height to the taller level. At this time you should also add a small strengthening bar to the bottom middle of the frame, running from front to back. To add it, glue and screw into place from the front and back.

9. Add tops

The final strengthening trick is adding to table tops. First add the larger, lower top. This should overhang the front and left hand side by 1", over-hanging the back by 1/2". To attach this top, glue and nail - or screw - down into the frame.

Add the smaller top to the higher part of the table next. Again, the overhang should be 1" to the front and both sides.

10. Add edging strip and molding to top

Add the edging strip to front and sides of both tops. Use glue and small finishing nails to hold the strip into place against the plywood edge of the table top. Next, add the small molding to the meeting point between the top and the main frame, thus making the two look more like one unit.

11. Make base panel and attach to base.



To finish off the main unit we need to add a base board that will serve as feet. This is one solid plank that runs the entire length of the unit. Route a curve out of the top side to round it off (see diagram). Add to from and sides - using a mitered cut at each end - using screws and glue. The board should overlap 1" with the frame, providing adequate bonding space.

12. Make drawers

Take the two side pieces, the back and the inner front piece. Cut a groove in each one that is 1/4" from the bottom of each piece and is 1/4" wide. This groove will allow the base to slot into the drawer frame. Once you have cut the groove, glue and screw the sides to the back piece, slot the base into the groove and then glue and crew the inner front board. Make sure that the unit is square. The result is a box without a lid.

Attach a 16" drawer runner mechanism to each side of the drawer, and to the corresponding "hole" in the main unit of the chest. Ensure that all drawer mechanisms are attached at the same height, so that the drawers are interchangeable in the unit. To attach the runners to the main frame, you may need to add a strip of wood to the rear verticals.

Finally, you need to add the front of the drawer to the box unit. However, before doing this, you need to shape the front of the drawer. The edge of this should be rounded using the same router bit as you used for the edging around the bottom of the main unit. Once you have routed all four sides of the drawer front, attach it to the drawer unit by gluing and screwing from the inside of the drawer outwards.

13. Finishing

Finally, nail the two back panel pieces on to the back of the unit and sand the entire unit thoroughly and paint.

Smooth Transition

The Dryerbox is a small idea, but a good one. Very good, in fact. It's made of 22-gauge aluminized steel, drawn deep into a pan shape. Questions About Mold

I have heard many reports of mold in houses in the Houston area. What is mold and how can I prevent it from occurring in my house?

Mold is the common name for simple plants or fungi that are usually microscopically small. There are many varieties--some estimates put the number at a minimum of 40,000. These plants thrive on cotton, wool, paper, leather and wood, and they will grow anywhere in the home where there is moisture. The moisture may be in the material itself or in the form of airborne vapor. A typical mold is the one found in the grouted tile joints of shower walls.

Most mold spores found in homes do not present a serious health problem. However, people who have mold allergies could experience symptoms such as nasal stuffiness, eye irritation and difficulty breathing.

In the mold-related incidents you are referring to, severe moisture problems in a number of houses led to a comparatively

rare mold condition--that is, a concentration of the mold species called Stachybotrys chartarum. The family living in one home suffered a number of severe health-related problems.

There isn't room here to present a complete discussion of mold, but the drawing above gives an overview of the parts of your house that require careful inspection and maintenance. Pay particular attention to the roof and to chimney flashing to be sure that neither is admitting water. Likewise, leaks around doors and windows can admit water as can cracks in a basement floor. Condensation on windows, leaking plumbing and moisture vapor from a crawlspace are other sources that can cause mold to form. The best way to control mold is to keep building surfaces and cavities as dry as possible.

Horizontal Water Heater

Can the average upright water heater be installed horizontally as a spacesaving measure? **BILL AKERMAN** VIA INTERNET

No. An electric water heater is designed for upright installation. Even shipping one in a horizontal position can damage it. The heater's anode and the water inlet pipe are not supported. Placing the water heater horizontally can cause the pipe or the anode to flex against the tank's vitreous glass lining, damaging it.

Also, a horizontal installation would not be energy efficient. In an upright installation, the water inlet pipe terminates near the bottom of the tank. As the water is heated, it rises to the top of the tank where it is drawn off at the hot-water outlet. A horizontal installation would put the inlet and the outlet in the same plane and cause cold and hot water to be mixed.

SERVICE TIP: MAINTENANCE

Gas Appliance Safety

When you bring a new gas dryer or range home, or move a gas appliance to a new location, there are several things to be aware of so that the installation is troublefree and safe. First, the most important piece of advice is a general one, and that is to make the connection from the appliance to the gas supply using some form of flexible connector. This will allow movement of the appliance without the risk of breaking the seal on gastight connections, an obvious fire hazard.

Second, if you've never worked with pipe before, have a plumber or an appliance technician do the installation to be sure that it is gastight. If you have experience working with pipe, there are still several things to be mindful of:

- 1. When joining threaded fittings, be sure to make connections with compatible threads. Iron pipe thread is wedge-shaped and tapered. It will not make a gastight connection when joined to a flare-compression thread. For example, to make the connection to a dryer's black iron pipe nipple, you have to use a fitting that has a female iron pipe thread on one end and a compression thread on the other.
- 2. When working on black iron pipe, use

Teflon tape or pipe thread sealant that is certified for gas fittings. On flare-compression fittings, use thread sealant only. Be sure the sealant is rated for natural gas or propane, or both. Tape for working with gas fittings is yellow and is thicker than the white tape used for sealing water plumbing. Both the pipe thread sealant and the tape are clearly labeled as approved for gas connections.


- 3. In many cases, the entire job can be simplified with a dryer or range connection kit. This consists of a flexible connector, a variety of fittings, Teflon tape, leak-test solution, and instructions. These kits cost \$20 to \$25.
- 4. If you find that an existing gas appliance (in most cases, a range) is joined to the house's gas supply with a connector made from bare corrugated brass tubing, be sure to replace it. The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has issued a warning that this kind of connector has tubing that separates from its fittings. Visit the CPSC Web site for more information at www.cpsc.gov/cpscpub/pubs/gasconn.html.

Finally, be sure not to overtighten flare-compression fittings. A snug fit is all that is required to provide a gastight seal. When you're done, leak test all connections using a solution of dish detergent and water, or use ready-made leak-test solution.--*R.B.*



TheoryAccording to Olmsted

Whenever you put something together yourself, you are engaged in **designing**, however humble the project. Sometimes we take our designs for granted, because what we're putting together is so commonplace for us that we are no longer conscious of the designing process. For instance, you are employing design techniques when you compose a letter to send to somebody. Your basic design "elements" to accomplish such a task include vocabulary, spelling and grammar. Somewhat more complex elements, or design "principles" build directly on the basic elements. Letter-writing principles include conveying your ideas clearly and coming across as a courteous, intelligent individual. Your success with these principles will largely determine whether or not your letter achieves its ultimate objective.

And so it is with landscape design theory. First you must learn the basic design elements that underlie all landscape design theory. These fundamental elements will then serve as building blocks for learning and implementing the more advanced principles of landscape design theory. These tried and true principles are the cornerstones of the world's picture-perfect gardens.

The basic elements of landscape design theory are:

- Color
- Form (see picture on Page 2)
- Line (see picture on Page 3)
- Scale
- <u>Texture</u> (see picture above)

These five elements must be considered in designing both the hardscape and softscape of a landscape, the latter consisting mainly of gardens, lawns, shrubs and trees. While **color** is self-explanatory (for our purposes), and **scale** is simply the size of one component relative to adjacent components, the other three elements require some explanation. What can make these terms confusing is the fact that their meanings intertwine with each other, as we'll see on Page 2......

Garden Arbor Design

How to Build Garden Arbors

Building small garden arbors is an easy do-it-yourself project -- cheap, too, if you're willing to shop around a bit for your pressure-treated lumber. The garden arbor design in this project calls for a 2-post arbor; but you can apply the same principles to a larger wooden arbor. It will take the average do-it-yourself landscaper 2 days to build this garden arbor.

The Basics of the Garden Arbor Design: An Overview

Think of this project as involving five architectural layers:

- Concrete placed underground will secure the structure.
- 2. Two 4X4 posts will be sunk into that concrete.
- 3. Two 1x6 crosspieces will run along the sides of these posts at the very top, perpendicular to them. One

crosspiece will be on the outer side, the other on the inner side; thus they will "sandwich" the top 6" of the upright posts.

- 4. 2x4 rafters, in turn, will lie atop the crosspieces, perpendicular to them.
- 5. And 2x2s will lie across the rafters, perpendicular to them.

Cost of the Garden Arbor: Shopping Around for Cheap Lumber

The cost of lumber for this garden arbor project depends to some degree on the do-it-yourselfer's willingness to shop around. I went to a discount store to purchase the pressuretreated lumber for my own project. Now, to be sure, a lot of rejects end up in the lumber bins of such a store. I had to sort through about 20 boards on average to find 1 good board. Is it worth the extra work? Well, judge for yourself as you look over the following list of surprisingly cheap prices (all measurements are in feet):

- Five 2x2x8s at \$1.50 each
- Three 2x4x8s at \$2.48 each
- Two 1x6x12s at \$3.88 each

Even after the price for the two 4x4s is added in, the total for lumber came only to about \$30. If your information about building arbors derives from television shows, it may be hard for you to believe at first that the wood for a small arbor can be purchased for around \$30!

Supplies -- The Materials for the Garden Arbor:

- Pressure-treated lumber:
 - o Five 2x2x8s
 - o Five 2x4x3s
 - o Two 1x6x12s (hereafter referred to simply as the "crosspieces")
 - o Two 4x4 posts
- Gravel or crushed stone
- Pre-mixed concrete
- Deck screws
- Bolts, washers and nuts
- Scrap lumber

Note:

When I give lumber dimensions here, I am following a convention. Please note that a 4x4 is not really 4" by 4". Sounds odd, I know. But everyone calls them 4x4s, so I'm following that convention. In fact, they measure 3.5" x 3.5". Likewise, the so-called 2x4s are really 1.5" x 3.5".

Tools to Build the Garden Arbor:

- Wheelbarrow
- Garden hose
- Shovel
- Carpenter's level
- Jigsaw
- Circular saw or handsaw
- Drill
- Wood chisel
- Spade bit
- Stepladder
- File
- Tape measure
- Hammer
- Wrench

Garden Arbor Steps: Instructions for Building Do-It-Yourself Arbors

On the present page we begin with foundations for garden arbors: digging post holes, plumbing the arbor's posts, and pouring the concrete that will hold them in place.

- Dig 2 holes, spaced as far apart as you want the main posts of your garden arbor to stand (in the project photographed here, the posts stand about 8' apart on center). Make the holes about 1' wide and 3' deep.
- Place about 1/2' of gravel or crushed stone into the holes for drainage.
- Set one 4x4 arbor post in one hole, the other in the other hole.
- Lay a board across the tops of the two arbor posts. Place a carpenter's level on the board. If the board is level, your posts are standing at equal heights -- which is what you want. Otherwise,

- make the necessary adjustment.
- To ensure that the posts will be plumb (i.e., the vertical equivalent to "level"), nail scrap lumber to each of them to form temporary, stabilizing braces (for a picture of such braces, see photo above). With these braces in place, check for plumbness on all sides with a carpenter's level. If the posts aren't exactly plumb, adjust the positioning of the temporary braces, accordingly.

Garden Arbor Tip:

Be careful, when buying your 4x4 posts, to get the height you'll need. Remember, an 8' post sunk 3' into the ground leaves you with an arbor only 5' tall. If you get a deal that you can't pass up on some 8' 4x4 pressure-treated posts, though, it is possible to compensate for their lack of height. Buy galvanized post anchors for each post. Sink the post anchors into the concrete, instead of the posts themselves. The pressure-treated posts would then be attached to these anchors, meaning all 8' would be above ground. Post anchors, however, can be expensive -- make sure that you're not defeating the purpose of getting the lumber at a cheap price!

Securing the Posts With Concrete

- Dump a bag of pre-mixed concrete into a wheelbarrow.
 Add water from a garden hose. Stir the water into the concrete with a shovel, until achieving the right consistency.
- Pour this concrete into one of the holes, around the base of the post. Repeat until hole is filled; and repeat for other hole.
- Allow this concrete to dry, or "cure" for at least one day.

Garden Arbor Tip:

While waiting, lay out the other boards on the ground, make your measurements, and pre-cut and pre-drill as much as possible, to save time.

With the concrete work done, on Page 3 the focus shifts to carpentry. Since these instructions are meant for non-carpenters, the emphasis will be on the easiest way to accomplish each task....



handsaw or circular saw to make these rafters.

Notching the Rafters

- Now we'll notch the rafters, for a tighter fit atop the crosspieces. Note also that, by adjusting the depth of the individual notches, you can correct discrepancies in levelness. This can be important when working with discount lumber. For instance, if one of the crosspieces is "bowed" (higher in the center than on the ends), your only chance to make the proper adjustments may well lie in your notching.
- Lay each rafter down on the ground the long way, so that one of the 2" dimensions is on the ground, the other facing up. On the part facing up, find the center point lengthwise. From this center point, measure out 1 3/4" to the left (mark with pencil) and 1 3/4" to the right (mark with pencil).
- Now simply repeat the last step, except you'll be going over another 1" on both the left and the right.
- It is from these two 1" areas, on either side of the 3.5" center area, that the notches will be cut (for a picture, see photo above). The notches will fit over the two 1" wide crosspieces.
- On each side of the 4" dimension, measure down 1". Make several 1" cuts down into this notch area, using whatever saw you're most comfortable with.
- Now go back with a hammer and wood chisel and strike into these cuts; chips of wood will start coming out, and you'll have a notch in no time. After chiseling, take a wood file and file away some of the roughness on the chiseled surface. Repeat for each (you'll have ten notches in all).
- Now that the cuts have been made, the focus switches to attaching the boards together to assemble the garden arbor.

The first step in assembling the garden arbor is to line up the crosspieces and the 4x4 posts. Once lined up properly, you'll be boring a hole that will stretch through all three pieces of wood, allowing you to insert a bolt that will unite the three pieces. You'll begin at one post, and then repeat the process on the other post.

Assembling the Garden Arbor:

- If you're not confident enough with your measuring skills to pre-bore all the holes and then fit everything together after, then it's time to bring the crosspieces over to the 4x4 posts, so that they can be lined up properly.
- First measure down 6" from the top of each post, on either the outer or inner side (doesn't matter which), and mark it with a pencil. For each post, take a small piece of scrap lumber, and screw it into the post with a couple of screws, so that the top of the scrap lumber runs along the line you just drew. Pick scrap lumber that is long enough so that it will protrude a couple of inches or so beyond each side of the post. These little "shelves" will function as temporary supports for your crosspieces.
- Now take one of the crosspieces and lay it across one of the temporary shelves (either front or back). The crosspiece should now be positioned in just the way that it will eventually lie, when the project is done.
- With this crosspiece lined up properly with respect to the posts, attach each end with a couple of screws, one near the top, one near the bottom. Repeat with the other crosspiece. Now you can remove the two temporary shelves that the crosspieces are resting on.

On Page 4 we move on the boring of the holes. Page 4 also contains a free garden arbor plan that beginners may find useful as a visual reference....



Free Garden Arbor Plan

Follow the Plan, Build the Arbor: It's Easy!

After completing the work on Page 3, you're now ready to make your wooden garden arbor design come to life! The next step in the building process is to tie your crosspieces and posts together. While following these steps, please refer to the free garden arbor plan (see the picture on the right):

- Insert a spade borer into a drill. The width of the borer will have to match the width of the bolts that you've chosen. I chose 1/4" bolts, so I used a 1/4" spade borer.
- With posts and crosspieces lined up (see Page 3), you can now use the drill with its attached spade borer to drill a hole through the crosspieces and posts (both left post and right).



Color codes indicate both board dimensions and order of placement: purple goes first, yellow last. David Beaulieu

there's an easy way to avoid having to drill first from one side, then from the other, hoping the two holes will meet. That's a bit too dicey for me. Instead, take the easy way out! Bore through as far as you can (you should be able to get half way into the post, anyhow), then remove the crosspiece that you've drilled through. Now continue boring through the post. You should be able at least to pierce the other crosspiece. Then you can widen the entry by switching sides and boring through the other crosspiece.

- Now hammer the bolts through the holes, and apply the washers and nuts.
- Take the rafters that you've already notched, and just slip them over the crosspieces, perpendicular to them. The notches will tell you where they fit, if you've measured properly in your notching; so this step is easy.
- Attach the rafters to the crosspieces with deck screws.
- Finally, lay the 2x2s on top of the rafters, perpendicular to them. Attach with screws.
- And you're done! Wait at least 6 months before staining your pressure-treated wood.

Because of the wait involved before you can stain the wood of your garden arbor, you won't be able to plant any vines on it for that first summer. Instead, spend the time looking at other people's arbors, and see what plant choices catch your eye.

Climbing roses and wisteria are two widespread <u>aesthetic</u> uses for arbors. Meanwhile, trellising grapes on arbors is a traditional <u>horticultural</u> use of arbors. But at this point in the discussion, we have moved beyond the *building* of arbors to a treatment of their function. And that, along with other arbor miscellany, is the subject of Page 5....

What of the linguistic history, or etymology, behind Arbor Day? Well, it is called **Arbor** Day because *arbor* is the Latin word for "tree" (the derivation of the "arbors" that we're dealing with, however, is *not* from this Latin word). Is there a connection between garden arbors and trees? According to Random House Dictionary, an **arbor** first and foremost is "a leafy, shady recess formed by tree branches, shrubs, etc." Only secondarily is an arbor defined as "a latticework bower intertwined with climbing vines and flowers." Clearly, then, the garden arbors that we build and train vines upon (i.e., "latticework bowers") have been developed out of a need to find stand-ins for shade-giving trees.

Day and garden arbors, such as grape arbors. In other words, it would be something of a stretch to connect them, despite their shared use of the word, "arbor." If you want to celebrate Arbor Day faithfully, plant a tree; save your plans for building a garden arbor for another day.

ArborDay.org relates the full history of Arbor Day celebrations. According to this site, it was on January 4, 1872 that J. Sterling Morton first proposed a tree-planting holiday to be called "Arbor Day." The proposal was made in Nebraska, which at the time was more or less a tree-less state. Morton's proposal was adopted, and the idea of observing an Arbor Day spread to other states later in the 1870s. States today most commonly observe Arbor Day on the last Friday in April. The observance of Arbor Day has even spread beyond the borders of the U.S.

What Are Garden Arbors Used For?

Arbors have many uses. For instance, there are the classic grape arbors, in which case the arbor has a horticultural function -- serving as a trellis for the grape crop. Arbors -- in conjunction with the vines that grow on them -- can also serve as privacy screens. Another function of the arbor is to provide shade, including deck arbors and patio arbors (arbors built over decks or patios to furnish them with shade). More often, arbors have an aesthetic purpose. Some landscapers like the look of a wooden arbor that forms an entrance to a garden. Likewise, arbors can function as entry gates for properties surrounded by fencing.

Trellises, Pergolas and Arbors

Two terms often associated with arbors are <u>"pergola"</u> and "trellis." Any structure, including an arbor, designed specifically to support vines is often called a trellis now, although traditional trellis design specifically involves the use of <u>latticework</u>.

Distinguishing pergolas from arbors is more of a challenge. Oversimplifying for the sake of brevity, it may help to focus on the fact that the word, *pergola* is Italian. Renaissance Italy loved its pergolas, which were essentially arbors with <u>masonry</u> columns, rather than wooden posts.

But this distinction, based on whether the supports are wooden or masonry, is breaking down now, as people use the term "pergola" more loosely. If there's any distinction at all that is still maintained, perhaps it is that pergolas are structures of somewhat more substantial architecture than are arbors. And if you're invited to a party at a house with a pergola, you're more likely to be served sherry than plain old wine....

How will your yard be used? Do you have children who are active outdoors? Do you yourself plan on using your yard for exercise,

sports, or entertaining? Answering these questions will help determine the appropriate landscape design for your needs. Extensive lawn space is useful in a yard that will see a lot of social barbecues, badminton and ball playing. But if you are more interested in turning your yard into a retreat meant for serenity, solitude and contemplation, the role of turf grass may be reduced drastically in favor of trees.

The various aspects of practical landscape design are too numerous and too complex to discuss at length here. Undoubtedly, however, one aspect that warrants inclusion in any introduction to landscape design is **energy conservation**. A well-planned incorporation of trees and shrubs in your yard, as in the following examples, is an effective means of energy conservation:

- <u>Deciduous</u> trees can be planted to the south and west of a home to serve as shade trees, reducing summer air conditioning costs. Because such trees will drop their leaves in winter, they won't deprive your home of sunlight when you *need* it.
- Evergreen trees planted to the north and west of a home can serve as windbreaks, as detailed by <u>William C. Welch</u>.
 By breaking the wind, such trees will reduce your heating costs in winter.
- Likewise, shrubs used as foundation plantings can reduce heating costs, creating an insulating dead air space around the home. Plant the shrubs 5' away from your foundation.



Turning to the aesthetics of your landscape design, you first have some decisions to make regarding hardscape, existing trees, and what you'll have as a view when you gaze out the window. Getting this part of the project right will make implementing the softscape refinements relatively easy. Hardscape features include:

- Fences and walls
- Patios and decks
- Stone or brick walkways
- Gazebos and arbors
- Statuary, water gardens and fountains

If you were giving a room a total

makeover, you wouldn't start by hanging pictures and arranging knickknacks, would you? Of

course not: such fragile refinements would simply be in the way as you did the heavier work, such as stripping the walls and

The way to begin a landscape makeover is not so very different, in principle. You begin with the heavier work -- the foundation for your landscape aesthetics -- leaving for last such icing on the cake as the planting of flower beds. Some basic guidelines follow for getting your landscape design project underway.

moving furniture. You save the refinements for last.

Unity, Vistas, Privacy Screens

- Your landscape should be in harmony with your home, to ensure **unity** in the overall appearance of the property. One consideration influencing unity is **proportion**. Large trees are in proportion with large homes, but are out of proportion with smaller homes. When in doubt, however, leave the tree in place -- provided that it doesn't pose a safety hazard.
- Accentuate desirable views. If you live on a rural hillside with the potential for panoramic views of a valley and surrounding hills, you probably won't want your home to be entirely encased in trees that will obstruct your view. Don't cut down all the trees, though. Determine what your finest vistas are, clear the trees in just those areas, and use the remaining trees to **frame** those nice views. When set off

- like a picture by grand trees to the left and right, nice views become truly spectacular views!
- By contrast, you'll want to block out undesirable views. A suburban home with close neighbors is an ideal candidate for a **privacy screen**. In addition to hedges, some of the options for privacy screens include the following hardscape features:
 - Wooden fences
 - Vinyl fences
 - o **Masonry** walls

With the hardscape already in place, it will be easier later to integrate the softscape with it in a seamless fashion. In the case of some hardscape features, complementary softscape elements are so commonly used in conjunction with them as to come to mind immediately. Let's look at these briefly.

Integration of Hardscape and Softscape

Water gardens, particularly those with fountains or statuary, can supply your landscape design with a focal point. Because such a water feature is, by itself, so impressive, the softscape needed to make it a true "garden" is rather minimal. A few container-held aquatic plants would be sufficient to complete the design. But certainly more elaborate softscape treatments are possible as well.

Similarly, in installing gazebos, arbors, decks and patios you are laying the groundwork to display your softscape elements in a more favorable light than would be possible without hardscape. A vine on a well-located arbor becomes more than just a vine: it becomes a festive garland beckoning us to pass under its arch. Gazebos, patios and decks are all excellent choices for showcasing window boxes and potted specimen plants.

Outdoor lighting extends the time that you may appreciate hardscape and softscape features -- namely, into the night. Outdoor lighting becomes particularly important to landscape design in the winter. Not only are there fewer daylight hours in winter, but there is also inherently less visual interest on the landscape so you have to make the most of everything at your disposal. Picture a simple spruce tree, rising out of a blanket of snow, with a stone wall as a backdrop. By throwing a spotlight at night on this scene to highlight it, you create a winter wonderland.

Lawn or Garden?

Now that your structural elements are in place, it is time to turn your attention to the **softscape**. Typically, your softscape will include at least some **lawn**. The percentage of your landscape to be occupied by lawn will depend partly on practical considerations, as discussed in Part 1. But aesthetic attitudes play a part as well. If a flat expanse of grass just isn't inherently interesting enough for your tastes, you'll probably want flowering trees (see photo above) in your landscape design. And you'll certainly want to have a **garden** of some sort.

Gardens can take many forms:

- There are, of course, **vegetable** gardens. Do not underestimate the aesthetic potential of vegetable gardens. Evenly planted rows of leafy vegetables, for instance, can be very attractive. Cucumber plants can be trained up a trellis or over an arbor just as any other vine can.
- Another garden type that can yield aesthetic as well as culinary delights is the herb garden. The <u>knot garden</u>, pleasing to the eye for those who enjoy design patterns, is often composed of herbs.
- Cottage gardens typically rely heavily on perennial flowers.
 Evocative of the traditional English countryside of the peasants, cottage gardens represent the informal design style. For more on the historical debate between formal and informal landscape design camps, please consult <u>History of</u>

Very likely, the answer to this question lies in adherence to the principles of design. For a full treatment of landscape design principles, please consult Landscape Design Theory for Beginners. The elements that underlie the principles of landscape design, which are defined in that article, are as follows:

- Color
- Form
- Line
- Scale
- Texture

Armed with an understanding of these elements, one is then able to utilize the principles of landscape design (also explained in <u>Landscape Design Theory for Beginners</u>), which include:

- Proportion
- Transition
- Unity
- Rhythm
- Balance
- Focalization

How To Accomplish Tree Stump Removal Without Stump Grinders

A tree has been felled and its wood removed, but its stump still sits there, firmly rooted in the ground. What's the best way for removing tree stumps? Stump grinders can be rented but are expensive. Manual removal is cheap but has the drawback of being labor-intensive. Instead, I will focus on another cheap alternative that is also easy. But be forewarned: It requires some patience.



You can use a mattock for manual stump removal.

Difficulty: Easy

Time Required: 1 Hour

Here's How:

- 1. The first step is your decision on which technique to use. If you opt for manual removal of tree stumps, use a mattock. Its broad end allows you to dig around the stump; the other end functions as an axe for chopping your way through tree roots. Dig and chop your way under the rootball to the taproot. For large tree stumps, taproots may be large enough to require cutting with a full-size axe.
- 2. The rest of this article focuses on another technique, which is essentially a way to hasten the natural processes that would eventually break down the tree stump anyhow even if you didn't lift a finger. But to hurry nature along, you'll be supplying 2 ingredients in unnatural quantities to speed up the rotting process: nitrogen and water.
- 3. But first, using a chain saw, cut the stump down as close to the ground as you can, without allowing the chain saw's teeth to strike the ground (this would dull your chain).
- 4. Drill holes a few inches deep into the tree stump in numerous places, using your widest drill bit. The wider and deeper the holes, the better.
- 5. Fill these holes first with water, then with a fertilizer high in nitrogen. For instance, you could use cow manure. If you're using a commercial fertilizer instead, make sure the first of the 3 numbers of the fertilizer's NPK is the highest (for instance, a straight nitrogen fertilizer such as 45-0-0).
- 6. Soak the ground all around the tree stump. Cover the tree stump with a plastic tarp. The tarp will act as a barrier to help retain

- moisture in and around the tree stump.
- 7. Apply an organic mulch over the plastic tarp, and water it thoroughly. An organic mulch, such as tree bark or hay, will hold additional moisture, keeping the area even wetter. Wet mulch is also heavy, which will help weigh the tarp down, so that it doesn't blow away. For additional weight, roll some heavy stones onto the tarp.
- 8. The final thing you need to do for this project is -- to be patient! You're speeding up the natural process of rotting by employing the steps above, but this technique is still not for those who need stump removal N-O-W.
- 9. You'll reduce your wait, however, by periodically removing the mulch and tarp for a moment and once again thoroughly soaking the tree stump and the ground around it. If you still have that nitrogen source at your disposal, add more of it. Then reapply the plastic tarp and mulch. Soak the mulch again, too.

Tips:

1. There is a product called, "Stump Remover" that breaks down the wood fiber of tree stumps, leaving them porous. The porous wood then absorbs kerosene readily. After the porous wood is soaked with kerosene and ignited, it will burn away. The flame is a low, smoldering flame. If the use of kerosene and flame is acceptable to you, this is another cheap and easy option.

How To Build an Elegant Brick Patio Without Brick-Cutting

A simple design plan to make laying brick patios easy for do-ityourselfers. This brick patio design is easy to build yet elegant, laying the bricks in a striking pattern that requires no cutting!

Difficulty: Average

Time Required: 2 days for a small patio

Here's How:

- 1. Measure out the desired area. Rectangular design plans are easier to execute than curved designs. To ensure that you have a perfect rectangle, measure the 2 diagonals: they should be of equal length.
- 2. Dig out the area, to a depth of 8". With a level, check that your excavation's floor slopes (1/4" per running foot) away from the house for drainage, so water will run away from the house and patio.
- 3. Do a test run by laying your brick pattern, to check your measurements. This way, if your initial measurement was off, you can correct it now. There should be about 2" extra all along the perimeter.
- 4. This extra 2" along the perimeter is for the insertion of brick edging (the bricks are about 2" thick). Stand the bricks on end, "shoulder to shoulder." Tap them into place with a rubber mallet.
- 5. The idea in Step #4 is to frame the rectangular area. Remove the bricks that you laid as a test run. Pour crushed stone into this framed area, to a depth of 4".
- 6. Tamp down the stone. Lay landscape fabric down over the stone, to suppress potential weeds later. Now pour 2" of sand over the landscape fabric. Use a long 2x4 as a screed (see link #1 below).
- 7. Starting at one end of the rectangle, run this screed along the sand, leveling the sand out. You want the sand's level to end up 2" below the tops of the edging bricks.
- 8. Excess sand in Step #7 will thus be redistributed to low

- areas, and you'll end up with an even surface. Tamp the sand down. Now it's time to begin laying the brick patio flooring -- for real!
- 9. Begin in a corner, pressing the bricks down into the sand. Make them abut as closely together as possible. Strike the bricks with a rubber mallet to settle them into the sand.
- 10. You want "paving" bricks for this project. In the measurements that I'm giving, I'm assuming 4" x 8" bricks, about 2" thick. Brick pavers come in other sizes; but this size is easiest to work with.
- 11. For a design pattern, I'm suggesting the "basket weave" (see link #2 below, which links to an illustration of the basket weave design pattern).
- 12. The basket weave pattern is elegant yet simple, requiring no cutting of bricks. Avoiding cutting will save you in time, money and frustration!
- 13. Run a mason's line across your forms as you proceed, row by row, in laying your bricks. The mason's line will serve as a guide for evenness.
- 14. After laying the bricks, spread some sand over them. With a broom, work this sand into the cracks. Then, with a garden hose, gently spray the bricks, so the sand will settle between the cracks.
- 15. If the cracks still aren't totally filled, repeat Step #14. Now you're done!

Tips:

- 1. For a graphic illustration of the basket weave design pattern see <u>the basket weave page</u>. This is an attractive flooring design, without any brick-cutting.
- 2. The key to keeping the project pressure-free is Step #3. For the mathematically-challenged, it's comforting to know -- ahead of time -- that all the bricks will fit within the frame, and fit tightly.
- 3. As you lay bricks (Steps #9 #13), kneel neither on the sand nor directly on the bricks. Kneel instead on plywood atop the bricks. You don't want to make the sand uneven or dislodge the bricks.
- 4. Rectangular plans work best for small patios. To soften the rigid lines, simply plant container gardens along the edges. For larger patios, consider curved designs -- but be ready to cut bricks!
- 5. A brick that's 4x8x2 makes this project go more smoothly: in a basket weave design you want the widths of 2 bricks to equal the length of 1, so that you can develop a clean checkerboard pattern.

What You Need:

- shovel and rubber mallet
- level
- crushed stone
- landscape fabric
- paving bricks

- mason's line
- plywood to kneel on
- broom
- garden hose
- one long 2x4 for screed







Base Plan

Draw a base plan to scale. For most properties a scale of 1/8"=1' is workable; for small properties or a particular area of a larger development 1/4"=1' may be better. Graph paper with lines indicating a particular scale may also be helpful. Include all major features on your drawing such as existing walks, terraces, outbuildings, trees, shrubs, drives, property lines, easements, utilities, etc. After preparing the base plan, place tracing paper or tissue paper over the original plan to sketch possible ideas and solutions to your landscape needs and problems.



Always indicate compass directions in relation to the house by drawing an arrow (N->) pointing north. You may also want to show the direction of the rising sun. In winter, the sun rises a little south of east and sets a little south of west. In summer, the sun rises somewhat north of east and sets somewhat north of west.



Diagram and place space needs. Again, tape tracing paper over your plot plan and go back to your list of needs from step two. Place needs and activities where they can serve best and provide enough space for each need. (For example: and outdoor living area should be of sufficient size for the use it will receive.) Rather than decide upon the shape of a lawn, terrace or parking area at the beginning, let these forms develop from and reflect the needs listed in the beginning.



The following areas are frequently found in the home landscape. Develop each according to your family's needs and priorities.



Work or Service Area. The work or service area can be convenient, orderly and attractive.

Lawnmowers, wheelbarrows, tools, insecticides and fertilizers all need to be stored in a dry convenient location. If tool and equipment space is not already provided, plan for one. Since many service areas are most convenient when adjacent to the garage or carport, consider adding your storage area to an existing wall.

Garbage storage and clotheslines should be near the kitchen and laundry rooms. Allow at least four feet around the clotheslines to keep clothes from rubbing against fences, plants and walls. If only used occasionally, retractable or folding clotheslines may be the most practical.

Service areas can also contain a compost pile or space for cutting flowers and vegetables.

Consider screening the service area from view with either structures or plants to make it an attractive as well as functional part of the landscape.

Recreation or Active Sports

Area. Features such as a swimming pool, shuffle board and tennis courts require considerable space and investment. A tennis court is normally 120 x 60 feet and a badminton court is 22 x 44 feet; swimming pools vary in size.

If some of these facilities are on your list of needs but not practical for immediate installation, you



may consider leaving open turf areas that can be used for badminton, other games and play.



Outdoor Living and Entertaining

Areas. Terraces and patios are an integral part of many Texas homes and should be located, if possible, where they will receive summer breezes and afternoon shade. If sun is a problem, add trees of overhead shading structures.

Outdoor living areas are usually

adjacent to living areas of the house where they can easily be served and seen from inside. With the cost of interior floor space at an all-time high, outdoor living areas can economically add entertaining and living space. Even when not in use, well-planned, attractive decks and terraces adjacent to the house give a feeling of added space to interior rooms. Attractive, long-lasting outdoor furniture and accessories (such as water features, sculpture and container plants) can be useful and enrich outdoor living areas.

Some families have several outdoor living areas. Small terraces adjacent to bedrooms, bath areas and dining rooms are becoming more popular. A terrace may be placed away from the home to take advantage of a striking view. good breezes or the shade of an unusually beautiful tree.

Public and Entrance Areas. A

large front yard is often a questionable use of land and resources. The parklike expanses found in some of our older subdivisions are pleasant but of little practical value. If your lot is small and building codes allow, consider developing the entrance area as a courtyard providing more use area for the family. If street parking is a problem use part of this area for off-street parking.




Parking and enclosed front courts can be both attractive and functional.

Provide shade where it will most benefit your home's energy conservation. Keep plantings simple with shrub masses, groundcovers and flowering trees used to serve real purposes.

Build walks and drives well and have them as direct and convenient as possible. Walks should be a minimum of 3 1/2 feet and preferably 4 feet wide. Provide a larger paved area at the entrance, if possible, since people tend to congregate there.

A few container plants, small flowering trees or specimen shrubs help to make the home's entrance a focal point. Other features which focalize the entrance include architectural accessories such as attractive light fixtures, street numbers and front doors.



Children's Play Area. Locate the play area where someone inside the house can easily see it. A sand pile and swing sets are popular as well as paved areas for riding toys, play houses and tree houses. Keep the designs simple and easy to maintain and consider how the area might be used after the children are grown.

When it comes to planting, good soil is the foundation on which you build a good garden. And building good soil involves analyzing what you've got and supplementing what it needs.... Along with organic matter or humus there are three primary minerals that make up soil: sand, clay, and silt. The right balance of both humus and minerals will achieve garden loam, the best soil for growing plants.

Planting and Spacing ~

Click on the flower in landscape or click on the flower name in the list above and you will find all the planting and care instructions for each individual flower. Or visit our extensive <u>Annuals</u> and Perennials section.

Spacing is a personal preference. Planting flowers closer together will give a fuller coverage in your garden and vice versa. As a general guideline you can start with the following:

- 1. Multiply the length by the width of your garden or planting area to get your square footage.
- 2. Multiply the square footage by 4. This is the number of plants you will need for full coverage in your garden.

Example:

4 foot length x 3 foot width = 12 square feet

12 square feet x 4 = 48 plants

Tips for Planning Your Garden ~

For beginners it is important to draw a plan.

- Choose plants suitable for the site (light, soil, etc).
- Arrange plants according to their height (ie taller flowers at back, shorter at front).
- Arrange according to plant form and texture.
- Arrange according to flowering periods for constant blooms.
- Arrange in groupings by type and color considerations.



Well, you've come to the right place.

This article is meant to serve as a springboard for those interested in building decks, who seek information geared for the beginner. It is beyond the scope of this article to provide an exhaustive treatise on all aspects of constructing decks. But the article should provide novices with enough information to get them started. I'll focus on the essential steps in deck building, with emphasis on the initial steps that get the project off on a sound footing. Space does not permit treatment of the finishing touches, such as railings and deck sealers. My goal is simply to furnish you with a solid foundation – both literally and figuratively.

Once beginners get started on a project as complex as this one, one of their most obvious needs will be to ask questions. An opportunity to do so will arise when they shop for lumber and other supplies for the deck project at a hardware store. The hardware store can be a great source of free information. But to ask intelligent questions, you need some knowledge of the subject

already, including knowledge of the terminology used to discuss the various aspects of it. You also need an introduction to some basic problem solving in deck construction. For instance, on Page 3 we discuss the freestanding deck as an alternative to the type that gets secured directly to a house. Why? Because although you can still place a freestanding deck adjacent to a house, a freestanding deck obviates a problem for the non-carpenter: namely, it avoids having to remove siding from your house (a scary thought for most of us).

You need to be made aware of such challenges that await you in your initial foray into deck construction. Once you become aware of the problems – and mull over some suggestions as to how to solve them – you'll be brimming with astute questions when you walk into the hardware store. Speaking of the hardware store, some of the supplies you'll need to build a deck are likely to include the following:

- Flashing
- Caulking compound
- Pre-mixed concrete
- Gravel or crushed stone
- Cinder blocks
- Post caps
- Post bases
- Seismic ties
- Joist hangers
- Cardboard tube concrete forms
- Rebar
- Stainless steel or HDG nails (either ring-shank nails or spiral-groove, for better holding power; alternatively, use screws)
- Joist hanger nails
- HDG bolts or lag screws, and washers

The following are some of the tools you may need for this deck project:

- Shovel
- Carpenter's level
- Carpenter's square
- Plumb bob
- Wheelbarrow (for mixing concrete)
- Caulking gun
- Drill
- Wrench (to tighten lag screws)
- Hammer
- Circular saw

- Tape measure
- Safety eyeware
- Scrap lumber for bracing

To build an outdoor wooden deck, obviously the primary supply needed will be the wood. It would be nice if I could provide the dimensions for your lumber, but there are really too many variables involved to give precise dimensions. Lumber dimensions would depend, for example, on the type of wood that you choose: pressure-treated, cedar, etc. The size of the deck is another variable.

Perhaps even more frustrating is the fact that, when all is said and done.

the choice about lumber dimensions is probably not yours to make, anyhow. Zoning laws and building codes will have a lot to say about what you can and cannot do in your deck project.

Before you even begin with your deck design (let alone deck construction), check into local zoning ordinances. Depending on where you live, you may be surprised to learn just how restrictive zoning can be.

You should talk with your local building inspector, too, so as to comply with building codes in your area. Usually you'll need to file for a building permit. Don't look at your chat with the building inspector as all bad, though. For here's another chance to pose some intelligent questions about deck building and get some free answers from someone with a wealth of information on the subject.

Local building codes may tell you specifically what lumber

dimensions you need. Because they are *local*, there's no point in speculating about them here. But, for the purposes of this article, I will assume that the posts you'll be using as underpinnings for the deck are either 4x4s or 6x6s. I'll assume the rest of the lumber will be 2 x something (at least 2x6, and possibly as high as 2x12). Note, however, that a 2x10, for instance, is not really 2" by 10" (that's just a naming convention). It's really 1.5" x 9.5".

Getting Started With the Deck Construction: Preparing the Site

Upon finishing your deck design plans and assembling the necessary tools and supplies, step one of construction will begin: preparing the site. This step is necessary if you'll be building the deck over an area that is currently grass-covered.

Once you know how large a rectangle you want the finished deck to occupy, measure out this area and make marks on the ground to indicate where the deck will lie. To ensure that your rectangle is true, measure diagonally from corner to corner, both ways (i.e., upper left to lower right, and upper right to lower left). You want these measurements to be equal.

Using a shovel, remove any grass or weeds from this measured area, to form your working space. Later, before closing off this working space with decking, apply mulch over this space to suppress weeds. But for now, your main concern is to furnish yourself with as level a working space as possible. This will be important later in the project, when you dig holes for concrete piers – which need to end up at the same height! You'll be more likely to achieve this if you start off on level ground.

On Page 3 we'll take a look at what may be one of the major decisions you'll need to make in your deck-building project....

Building a Freestanding Backyard Deck

A Do-It-Yourself Alternative to Traditional Deck Design

Although the backyard deck doesn't have to be an extension of the house, the majority of decks do abut against a house wall. Building such a deck can present a challenge. On this page I discuss an alternative that is easier - freestanding decks.

Decks that rest smack up against a house usually derive structural support on that end by being attached to the house with bolts (or lag screws). But you can't just blindly shove the bolt anywhere. Since

you're trying to achieve structural support, the wood in that area needs to be part of something substantial, something that is part of the underlying framework of the house: either the wall studs or floor joists. But you and your deck need to gain access to this solid wood – meaning you have to remove the siding of your house in that area (i.e., if your house is covered with clapboard, vinyl siding, aluminum siding, or beveled wood).

For the non-carpenter, removing your house's siding is a pretty scary proposition. Let's face it: Most of us take a "Leave well enough alone!" attitude towards our houses. We don't want to screw up anything....

The good news is that there's an alternative method, while still building the deck adjacent to your house: namely, the freestanding deck. Freestanding decks are a bit more work, because the house-end of the freestanding deck will have to rest on piers, in lieu of being connected to the house. That means

extra digging for you, and additional concrete work. But for the sake of your peace of mind, this alternative may be worth the extra work.

But now that you know about freestanding decks, I'll discuss the other method as well -- that of attaching the deck directly to the house for support -- just in case you're feeling brave.

Carefully mark out where the <u>header board</u> should be attached to your house. The level at which the top of the header board rests should be the same as the level of your <u>joists</u>, atop which you will be attaching your <u>decking</u>. It is critical to ensure that the header is not only at the proper height, but also that it is level. The success of the whole project depends on this. The length of the header board equals the total length of the deck, minus 3". Why minus 3"? Because the outermost joist on the left of the deck, as well as that on the right (as you face the house), should overlap the header board and be nailed to it. The joists will be, let's say, 2 x 8s. As mentioned on the previous page, that means they're actually 1 1/2" thick. Then multiply by 2.

Remove the siding where the header board must go. Tuck flashing up under the piece of siding that remains above this area. Roll the flashing down the side of the house, low enough that it will extend to a level below the bottom of your header board (the flashing will rest between the wall and the header board). Form a "lip" at the bottom, so that the water will be channeled away from the house. On the flashing, make marks where the bolts or lag screws must penetrate. Pre-drill the holes and caulk them.

Make corresponding marks on the header board, and make sure everything lines up. Now drill holes in the header board for the bolts or lag screws, and caulk the holes to further seal off your work from moisture problems. A slight space must also be left between the header and the wall, to allow rain to run freely down between the wall and the back of the header, averting rot. If you slide washers onto the lag screws or bolts in the back before securing the header, you'll create the spacing you need. Tighten the bolts or lag screws.

That takes care of the house-end of the deck. On Page 4 we'll proceed to the sides, as well as to the opposite end....

Do-It-Yourself Deck Construction: Foundations for Decks

Footings, Piers and Posts for Your Wood Deck

With the header board in place, support has now been provided for the deck at the house-end. At the opposite end, support will derive from a pier of some sort, sunk into the ground. Deck builders use a variety of techniques to accomplish this, but I will present one that I believe to be easiest for do-it-yourself deck building.

These deck piers do not have to be

Before digging, it will be helpful to nail the two outermost joists (extreme left and extreme right, as you face the house) to the header board. At the opposite end, use temporary braces to prop them up. These joists can serve as a reference point when working on the pier holes. More importantly, make sure that these 2 joists are level - both front to back along the same joist, as well as across the span from one joist to the other (at both ends).

Don't be afraid to fuss over this now, even if it takes quite a bit of time to get it just right. You'll spare yourself a plethora of problems later. You'll be calculating the height of your ground supports based on the level of these joists.

Nor is levelness your only concern. You really want your rectangle

to start taking shape as soon as possible, so that you can begin squaring up your angles. For the joists must form right angles with the header board; use a carpenter's square to make sure you begin building your rectangular frame at perfect right angles. Remembering a little high school geometry here certainly doesn't hurt your chances. You can make use of the fact that, in a right triangle with a base of 3', the side perpendicular to the base will be 4', and the diagonal side 5'. If your angle is off, now is the time to adjust it – not after everything is secured!

After installing these outermost joists, run a tape measure down from the header along each joist, stopping at the distance where you've determined the piers should be. Mark it. Now run a string tightly between these 2 marks, from joist to joist, spanning the whole width of the deck. This string will be your guide as to where to locate the piers. Run a plumb bob down from this string to the ground, and mark that spot. You are now ready to begin digging.

Pier holes should extend below the frost line to avoid heaving during freeze and thaw cycles. Dig each hole the same depth, again using the plumb bob as a guide. At the bottom apply a layer of crushed stone. Mix concrete and build a small form for a square concrete footing, according to building codes. Let the concrete cure. You are now ready to do more concrete work, this time for the pier itself.

Hardware stores carry a waxed cardboard tube used as a circular concrete form. Just set this form on the cured footing, plumb it, and mix and pour more concrete. Etching marks on the forms to serve as guides, make each pier the same height. Reinforce the concrete with rebar. You'll want the top of your concrete piers to be about 2' above ground level. Before the concrete cures, place a post base onto the top of each pier. These post bases will allow you to unite the wooden posts you're using with the concrete piers. Allow the concrete to cure again.

One of the biggest challenges in deck building will be encountered at this point in the project: making the house-end and the opposite end of the deck the same height. More than at any other step, this is the place to apply the do-it-yourself carpenter's golden rule: Play around with it first as much as possible to get the right alignment, before cutting anything or securing anything. Otherwise, you only have one chance to get it right – in which case, I don't like my chances!

On Page 5 we'll tackle this challenge -- the last difficult step in building a deck.



Deck Design: Keep It on the Level

Using Cinder Blocks as Temporary Supports

Use cinder blocks at this point to stand in temporarily for the wooden posts. That way, you can play around with the height and make sure you get it level (for the components at this end of the deck, see picture on right). But how do you check for levelness across such long distances? The answer is to run a long, straight board from the header to cinder blocks at the other end, and place your carpenter's level upon this board. Once you've found the height that will give you a level deck, you can just take note of the distance covered from the bottom of the cinder blocks to the top of the cinder blocks.

But what about levelness in the other dimension – left to right? If you've been careful so far in installing your header board and side joists (keeping everything level), you'll now reap the rewards for your attention to detail. The side joists are your guides for keeping everything level left to right.

piers to the bottom of the joists. On this end of the deck we'll be using another piece of wood that will rest upon the posts, called a "girder." The girder roughly corresponds to the header board at the other end, in the sense that it will serve as the support for the joists. But there's an important difference. Joists will "hang" from the header board using joist hangers (which keeps them on the same level as the header board), but on the opposite end, joists will rest *on top* of the girder. The girder will be the length of the header board plus 3". Deck builders often unite 2 boards to form a nice thick girder; for instance, two 2x10s to form, in essence, a 4x10.

Therefore it is the height of the joist *plus* the height of the girder *plus* the height of the post that the temporary cinder blocks spanned vertically. Or to put it another way: Take the distance covered by the cinder blocks from top to bottom, subtract the height of the joist and the height of the girder from it, and you'll have the height needed for the posts (see picture at upper right). Cut posts accordingly.

With both the posts and the girder cut to the right lengths, assemble them to form a unit, using post caps. Transfer this unit onto the concrete piers, using the post bases previously installed in the concrete to fasten the posts to the piers. Once the post-and-girder unit is secured to the piers, the top of the girder should meet the bottoms of the two outermost joists. If so, we've successfully completed the hard part of this project!

Although it's still possible to screw something up later in the project, we'd probably be able to rectify it easily enough. It is in this sense that I referred on Page 1 to the steps presented in this article as the "essential" steps. If these steps are botched, you'll probably have to start over from square one. But if you get through them successfully, the rest isn't too bad.

That's why I've focused on the project's initial steps. Once completed, you'll simply install the other joists. You'll use fasteners called "seismic ties" to attach the joists to the girders. Let the joists at this end stick out beyond the girder willy-nilly, until they're all in place. Then cut their ends off all at once, at some predetermined distance from the piers. These ends can be capped by a face board, if you prefer that look.

Your final major step is cutting the decking boards themselves and nailing or screwing them to the tops of the joists. Stagger the decking so that the seams don't all line up; the deck will not only be more stable structurally this way, but will also look better. If your deck will be high off the ground, building codes dictate adding a railing.

But believe me: After all we've been through up to this point, the railing will be a piece of cake.







Basic Landscaping Principles

Landscaping Goals

A successful landscape scheme has several goals, including beauty, privacy, comfort, safety, convenience, flexibility and ease of maintenance. Though you may not be able to achieve them all, you'll succeed if you design with these goals in mind.

Beauty: You may consider a beautiful pool or spa setting almost as important as a good swim. Create this environment by blending the pool or spa and other landscape elements with the house to achieve an aesthetic balance throughout the whole area.

Privacy: If privacy is your primary concern, include trees, fences, walls, screens or hedges in your plan to block the view of the pool or spa area from outside your yard.

Comfort: For swimming, soaking, sunning or entertaining, you'll be happier in a setting that's been adjusted for particular climatic conditions. You'll need room for lounging, as well as the right combination of design elements to modify sun or wind.

Safety: Planning a safe pool area—not only for your own family but for your neighbors as well—;needs to have high priority. Self-closing, self-latching and self-locking gates and safety fencing around the pool (required by law in many communities) or yard will help keep children, animals, and even adults out of the pool when you are not around. Passageways near the pool need to be well-defined, lit at night and not slippery or obstructed.

Convenience and flexibility: Try to incorporate areas for pool-related activities like cooking, eating, entertaining, showering and changing into your plan. The more convenient to the pool or spa these facilities are, the more you'll enjoy them without worrying about traffic in and out of your house.

Give landscape elements multiple jobs: design built-in benches that also store furniture, sports gear or garden equipment; install adjustable screens that add shade and block the wind; build a covered firepit that doubles as a sunning deck or low table. Easy access to your pool from more than one of your main living areas also gives flexibility, but will probably require an alarm or self-closing doors for safety reasons.

Ease of maintenance: With ever-rising maintenance costs, you'll want to choose materials very carefully. Consider using wood that is naturally water-resistant, such as redwood, masonry surfaces that need no painting, rustproof furniture and trees and shrubs that drop a minimum of leaves and flowers.

Basic Landscaping Principles

Landscaping Ground Rules

As you plan the setting for your pool or spa, keep four basic landscape goals in mind: unity, balance, variety and proportion.



Interconnected rectangles create an attractive, unified theme.

Proportion

Patio and decks are in proper scale to each other, the pool, and house.

Balance

Arrangement of deck, lawn, and pool is pleasantly unequal.

Variety

Different deck levels, construction materials, and textures and shapes of plants produce visual interest.

Unity in a pool or spa setting is achieved when everything looks as though it belongs together. No landscape element stands out; each blends with the other parts, as well as with the house and the lot.

To achieve unity, avoid designing too many distinctive units that will have to be tied together. The more units you divide your landscape into, the harder it will be to create unity.

Balancenot to be confused with symmetrydoes a lot to make a setting pleasing. Most likely, your pool or spa will be the focal point of your landscape design. Achieve balance by combining elements that produce the same visual weight on either side of this center of interest. A large tree or structure on one side of a pool, for example, can be balanced with a grouping of smaller trees on the other.

But don't try to make these relationships too equal. Remember

that mass isn't the only expression of visual weight; it can be expressed with color, form or interest, as well.

Variety breaks up what could be monotonous unity. Differing but complementary grade levels, textures, colors and shapes arouse visual interest both horizontally and vertically. You might vary an expanse of pavement with different paving materials, for instance, or plant shrubs in groupings of various heights and colors.

Proportion demands that the various forms, materials and open spaces of your landscape be in scale with one another. Nothing looks more out of place than a small pool in a yard as flat and expansive as a football field, or a patio that looks more like a parking lot than an entertainment area.

Landscape elements need to be in scale not only with each other, but also with your house, lot and pool or spa. If your lot is extremely large, try breaking the space up into several distinct areas. Screens, plantings,



patios or walks become borders or barriers that can divide your yard into intimate areas.

To maintain proportion in a small lot, keep things simple and uncluttered. Tall vertical screens used to enclose a small area will actually make it seem larger, as will solid paving. Use plants with restraintoverplanting adds clutter.

When selecting plants, keep their ultimate sizes and shapes in mind. Though a young plant may suit the proportion of your lot, within a few years it may grow so tall that the effect is spoiled.





Sloping Sites

Whether your lot is gently sloping, extremely steep or somewhere in between, you will have to consider special design requirements. The illustrations at left should provide some help.

A shallow slope can be converted with a minimum of grading into two or more level areas. Steps and a raised planting bed serve as retaining walls. Steps, ramps or both can provide the transition from one level to another. (Exercise caution when moving from level to level so as to reduce slips and falls.) Grass or ground cover can be used to prevent erosion in large unpaved areas.

A medium slope can be graded to form a series of gradual levels, each marked by a retaining wall and planted with ground cover.

A steep slope can often be conquered by a deck built beside the pool. Steep slopes often require the attention of professional landscape architects and engineers, however.

Besides their purely functional use in providing a connection between

different levels, steps and ramps play a major role in both grading the site and integrating buildings into the landscape. They also separate areas, direct foot traffic, display plantings and on occasion, even provide extra seating.

Decks and Pavement

The deck around the pool and any paved surfaces such as walks, patios or steps are functional and versatile landscaping tools. They add usable space, provide a transition from one area to another, allow for drainage and cover up barren soil.

Decks: Most pools and spas are surrounded by a symmetrical or free-form deck. Besides creating a frame for the pool, the deck provides a safe walkway around the edge of the pool, and, if enlarged, provides enough space for pool furniture and lounging.

In choosing a decking material, remember that the deck must be safe underfoot and not slippery, coarse, or uneven; using a heatreflective material will keep the deck's surface cooler. To prevent hose or rain water from draining into the pool, or water that has splashed onto the deck from re-entering the pool, the deck should drain away from the pool's coping by 1/4 to 3/8 inch per foot.

Be sure the deck is easy to clean or hose down-it forms the barrier between the pool and your plants and will catch falling leaves, grass clippings, and other debris.

Choose a decking material that blends with or matches other paved areas and is resistant to acid, algae, bacteria, chemicals, frost and funguses. It should also be non-slippery and cool under your feet. Brick, flagstone, tile, pavement block and finished, colored and exposed aggregate concrete are excellent decking materials. Other interesting materials are rubber, broomfinished concrete and cool-type concrete decking for hot climates.

Pavement: Paved surfaces in the pool area include patios, walks, lowlevel decks, steps and special activity areas. A patio can function as an entertainment or lounging area, as well as a transition between the house and pool. Walks permit passage from one area to another, provide a border for plantings and can break up the straight lines of an angular lot. Low-level decks add more surface space on problem grade sites such as hillsides. Steps not only link one level to another, but also separate areas and levels.

Brick, concrete (finished, colored or pebble surfaced), tile, flagstone, adobe blocks (use only the type with a burnt finish) and wood are durable and reliable pavement materials for the pool landscape. Again, consider surface texture and color, ease of maintenance, weather resistance and



drainage capability.

The right landscaping can turn your concrete hole-in-the-ground pool into a refreshing backyard oasis-just in time for summer. However, creating your own aquatic Garden of Eden isn't as simple as you might think. "There are many things involved in landscaping a pool that most homeowners just don't think about," says Jeff Rugg, a registered landscape architect outside Chicago. "If you're going to do it yourself, you need to consider things like types of plants, maintenance and even shading from trees before you start planting."

Susan Cusick, a landscape designer in Wenatchee, Wash, says it's equally important to consider your lifestyle and activity level. "If you really want a garden around the pool, you need to recognize that plants will always shed," she says. "And that often means more maintenance."

So, if you're the do-it-yourself type and want to create a unique landscape for your pool, keep these 10 basic rules in mind before you tackle the project.

- Avoid plants with thorns and trees with evasive root systems.
- Select trees and plants with large leaves that drop only once a year for easy cleanup.
- Take into account your region and choose as many native plants as possible.
- Plant trees on the south side of the pool for added shade.
- Make sure runoff water from flower beds will not drain into pool.
- Consider using gravel (rather than bark) to mulch beds close to the pool.
- · Avoid trees or plants that will extend over the perimeter of the pool.
- Use ground covers and ornamental grasses as alternatives to large plants and trees.
- Use container plants or raised beds with



retaining walls to protect plants from pool

• Remember landscaping can include decking, patios and gazebos, as well plants, flowers and trees.

Ultimately, your best bet is to discuss your options with a qualified expert or local nursery. That way, you can be sure your new landscaping will be something you can enjoy, not have to endure.






Solar Heating

If you own a spa, you will want a heater. Over the years, people have tried everything from solar energy to chopped wood to attain the high temperatures (up to 104 F/40 C) needed for a good soak, but in the end, the vast majority of spa owners opt for a gas or electric heater. No matter what you choose, rely on your dealer to determine the correct size heater for your spa, based on the number of people who will use it regularly and how often and how long they'll be soaking.

Pool Covers

Depending on material and design, a cover prevents heat loss by evaporation and radiation; allows the pool to collect heat from the sun; helps keep the pool free of debris; and, with safety covers, prevents children or animals from falling into the pool.

Covers must be removed completely when the pool is in use. A child or even an adult surfacing under a cover may not be able to lift it sufficiently to get air.



Wind: The Heat Thief While the sun and a heater are pumping heat into your pool, the wind sets up convection currents that steal that

same heat. Every square foot of the pool's surface gives up heat to the wind by evaporation, and the stronger the wind, the greater the heat loss.

To minimize the wind's effects, you can locate the pool where it's protected from the wind, erect screens or fences and enclose or cover the pool.

Pool Enclosures

Though most pools can be used all winter, even in the snow, some pool owners use pool enclosures to control the environment. They incur the added costs of maintaining what is essentially an indoor pool. Air quality must be maintained, and a dehumidifier must be installed to control humidity.

You can either purchase one of the manufactured canopies, extend your house to include a "pool room," or improvise an enclosure to fit the pool and its surroundings.

A variety of manufactured pool enclosures are available. The most economical are air-inflated canopies; one type even doubles as a pool cover when deflated. Some local laws regulate the use of pool enclosures.



Be sure to check building codes before installing one.



Solar Heaters

Put simply, solar heaters transfer the heat of the sun to the water in your pool. A properly installed unit will, in the long run, save you money off the cost of running a traditional heater by itself, although a gas or electric unit is often employed as a backup.

Compare warranties and have a written understanding of where the manufacturer's responsibility ends and the contractor's begins.



Pump and Motor



A Typical Pump and Motor

The combination of pump and motor draws water from the pool or spa, forces it through the filter and heater, and returns it to the pool or spa.

Pumps for residential pools and spas are almost always located on the intake side of the filter system so that

they draw water from the pool and push it through the filter, heater and other elements. These pumps have a hair and lint filter on the intake side of the pump to catch large particles of foreign matter before they enter and clog the pump impeller.

Most newer pool pumps are self-priming. They expel all the air from the system when they start running and thus maintain a suction. Running a pump that has lost its prime will cause the motor to overheat and damage the pump. When choosing a pump and motor, you'll want to consider the energy-saving models. When selecting a pump, you should choose a well-established, reliable manufacturer.

Another indication of quality is the length and terms of guarantees; be suspicious of any short-term warranties. A UL listinga listing with or recognition by the private Underwriters Laboratoriesis an important indication of safety. Equipment that receives such a listing has to pass high standards of testing.

Beware of claims emphasizing the horsepower of the pump; this is actually an incidental consideration if you expect to obtain the maximum operational economy.

When choosing a pump, consider its pumping capacity relative to your pool or spa size, the pump's operating costs and maintenance needs. To avoid corrosion, as many parts as possible should be made of materials that are corrosion-resistant. The motor should be water-resistant and electrically isolated and insulated.



For spas, two-speed pumps have gained popularity as an energy-saving measure. For example, many portable spas use a 3/4 hp pump that runs at two speeds. The higher speed is required to activate the hydrojets, which operate only while the spa is in use. The lower speed handles water circulation through the heater and filter; it operates at significantly lower

cost, keeping the water at the desired temperature, as well as sparkling



To determine the best pump size for a particular system, a consultant or an engineer will perform an overall evaluation of your needs, a relatively complex task involving the following steps:

- Determine the total number of gallons in the pool.
- Select the proper turnover rate for the pool.
- Calculate pipe sizes and layout for minimal friction losses.
- Select a pump that meets the calculated requirements. For this, the pump's performance curve, which indicates the number of gallons per minute it can pump, is used.
- Choose a filter model that will accept the number of gallons per minute that the selected pump will deliver. (The manufacturer will provide guidelines for the filter media selected.)
- Choose electrical wiring and circuit breaker sizes recommended in the pump installation manual.
- Consider the use of time clocks that precisely control the periods that pump and heater are on.



Automatic Pool Cleaners

Automatic pool cleaners work by vacuuming dirt off the pool bottom or agitating it so it goes down the main drain. The cleaner's pump may be separate from the filtration system or connected to it.



There are two main types of automatic pool cleaners that will save you the trouble of doing the work yourself. Both systems —vacuum and agitator—are

shown.

Vacuum system: An automatic suction side vacuum cleaner wanders randomly across the pool bottom and sucks up dirt. The dirt-laden water is then carried through a hose into the filtration system.

Pressure side sweeps: This type of cleaner floats below the surface of the pool and propels itself around. Trailing from it are two or more hoses that swirl under the force of water being pumped out of their ends. Another type, so-called robotic vacuums are self-contained units which are placed in the pool and clean automatically.

The Outdoor Kitchen

Family Cookouts and entertaining are often centered around the barbecue. But although the familiar kettle shape may still preside over the proceedings, you can go a step further—and bring the comfort and convenience of an indoor kitchen to poolside or patio.

The layout of your outdoor kitchen and your choice of cooking elements will depend on your favorite cooking technique, whether it's grilling, stirfrying, or griddle cooking.

Commercial barbecues and cooktops abound. More sophisticated masonry units incorporate built-in smokers, commercial-quality woks, or pizza ovens that accompany a traditional grill.



Facilities around the barbecue may include preparation and serving areas, storage cabinets, a vent hood, an under-counter refrigerator, a sink with disposal, a dishwasher, a wet bar, and a dining area. Built-in entertainment centers with TV or audio/intercom systems are other possible additions.

Maintaining and cleaning outdoor cooking facilities can be a challenge. If you use protective grill covers and rugged materials such as concrete or tile, you can clean the kitchen area simply by hosing it down.

Many outdoor kitchens are at least partially sheltered overhead or housed in a gazebo. Depending on the site's exposure and microclimate, you may need to add screens, trellises, or even heavyduty bifold or sliding doors to help screen wind and hot sun or provide temporary enclosure during winter months.

All woods are one or the other. The terms don't refer to a wood's relative hardness, but to the kind of tree from which it comes. Softwoods come from evergreens (conifers), hardwoods from broad-leafed (deciduous) trees. Decks are

generally built from softwoods. However, more economical offerings of hardwoods such as mahogany, angico, and plantation-grown teak (the boat builder's favorite) have recently entered the market.

Heartwood and Sapwood

A wood's properties are determined by the part of the tree from which it came. The inactive wood nearest the center of a living tree is called heartwood. Sapwood, next to the bark, contains the growth cells. Heartwood is more resistant to decay: sapwood is more porous and absorbs

preservatives and other chemicals more efficiently.

Among heartwoods, the most decay-resistant and termite-proof species you can buy are redwood and cedar. This durability, combined with their natural beauty, makes them favorites for decking. On the other hand, they are softer, weaker, and more expensive than ordinary structural woods such as Douglas fir and Southern pine. To get the best of both worlds, most professional designers use fir or another structural wood for a deck's substructure, but redwood or cedar for decking, benches, and railings. For any wood nearer than 6 inches to the ground or to



concrete foundations, though, choose decay-resistant heartwood or pressure-treated wood.

Grades

Lumber is sorted and graded at the mill. Generally, lumber grades represent several factors: natural growth characteristics (such as knots); defects resulting from milling errors; and commercial drying and preserving treatments that affect strength, durability, and appearance.

The higher the grade, the better the wood—and the more you will have to pay. One way to save money on your project is to choose the most appropriate grade (not necessarily the highest grade) for each element.

Redwood is usually graded for its appearance and for the percentage of heartwood versus sapwood it contains. Among pure heartwoods, Clear All Heart is the best grade, then B Heart, Construction Heart, and Merchantable Heart, in descending order.

Cedar grades, starting with the highest quality, are Architect Clear, Architect Knotty, and Custom Knotty. These grades don't indicate whether the lumber is heartwood or sapwood.

Rough and Surfaced Lumber

Most lumberyards handle both rough and surfaced lumber. Rough lumber tends to be available only in lower grades, with a correspondingly greater number of defects and a higher moisture content. Surfaced lumber, the standard for most construction and a must for formal decking, comes in nearly all grades.

Nominal and surfaced sizes

Be aware that a finished "2 by 4" is not 2 inches thick by 4 inches wide. The nominal size of lumber is designated before the piece is dried and surfaced, so the finished size is smaller. Here are some examples:

- 2 by 3 = 1-1/2" by 2-1/2"
- 2 by 4 = 1-1/2" by 3-1/2"
- 2 by 6 = 1-1/2" by 5-1/2"
- 4 by 4 = 3-1/2" by 3-1/2"

You may also run across decking boards with thickness designated in fractions—for example, "5/4." This traditional hardwood term means "five-quarter" or a nominal 1-1/4 inches (4/4 would indicate a 1-inch thickness). The actual thickness of these surfaced boards is usually about 1/4 inch less than the nominal measurement.

Treated Lumber

Though redwood and cedar heartwoods resist decay and termites, other woods that contact the ground or trap water may quickly rot and lose their strength. For this reason, less durable types such as Southern pine and Western hem/fir are often factory-treated with preservatives to protect them from rot, insects, and other sources of decay. These woods are generally less expensive and in many areas more readily available than redwood or cedar. They can be used for surface decking as well as for structural members such as posts, beams, and joists.



Working with treated lumber isn't always a pleasure. Compared with redwood and cedar, which are easy to cut and nail or screw, treated wood is often hard and brittle and more likely to warp or twist. Moreover, some people object to its typically greenish brown color (applying a stain can conceal it) and the staplelike incisions that usually cover it (some types come without these marks).

Because the primary preservative used contains chromium, a toxic metal, you should wear safety glasses and a dust mask when cutting treated lumber, and you should never burn it.

L- AND U-SHAPED SPACES

A house with an L or U shape almost cries out for a patio or deck. Surrounding house walls already form an enclosure; a privacy screen and a decorative structure overhead (such as an arbor, pergola, or even a simple roof) complete the "outdoor room." Often such a site can be gracefully accessed from several different parts of the house.

WRAPAROUNDS



A flat lot is a natural candidate for a wraparound patio, which enlarges the apparent size of the house while allowing access from any room along its course. If there's a gentle grade, rise above it with a slightly elevated wraparound deck, which the Japanese call an engawa.

DETACHED SITES



Garage Planning Checklist



Ready to make your garage into the organized area you know it can be? Good for you. But first thing's first, and the first thing you need is a plan.

Start off by calculating the garage's square footage to determine what can fit in it. Measure its length and width; then multiply them, i.e.: *length x width = garage area*. For example, a garage 20 feet wide and 25 feet long has an area of 500

square feet.

Once you know what you have to work with, use this checklist to be sure you've covered it all.

Storage and Work Areas

- The goal should be nothing on the floor unless it's too heavy to put away.
- Shelves, cabinets, pegboard and pegs, and overhead hooks are all good organizing tools.
- A solid workbench is an asset in a work area; as is a counter in a laundry room.

Lighting and Power

- Good lighting is vital for work areas and important for laundry, exercise and storage uses.
- Plan the number and location of electrical outlets. Is 240-volt power for tools needed?
- Windows and skylights contribute to lighting and improve livability and comfort.

Walls and Floors

- Insulating and finishing walls makes a space more comfortable.
- Instead of smooth drywall, consider texturing. Make it not just livable, but unique.
- Carpeting where a work/play space is located makes it warm and comfortable.
- Finishing with vinyl baseboards helps keep a floor clean.
- Painting the floor provides a completely different look. Oilbased paints are more durable than latex, but epoxy paints are made to withstand abuse.

Heating, Cooling and Ventilation



- Can you run ductwork to your attached garage for heat and air conditioning?
- Windows, fans, window air conditioners, and space heaters provide comfort with little or no modification.

Safety

- Make sure anything flammable is stored away from heat.
- Lock away dangerous chemicals, tools and equipment from
- Install smoke detectors and keep a fire extinguisher in the garage.
- In earthquake areas, use secure, enclosed storage for heavy, breakable items.
- Never run a car in the garage with the doors closed.
- Soak up toxic spills with absorbent or kitty litter and dispose of as hazardous waste.

Water Supply

- For a laundry, it's required. What work and permits are required?
- A utility sink is good in a workshop so you can clean up.
- A floor drain isn't recommended-toxic fluids can leak from a car and contaminate groundwater.

Now, a Reality Check

How much do you have to work with? Whether rebuilding or reorganizing, you have a finite area to work with, as well as a finite budget.

It turned out local code required a garage or at least a carport and as there was no place to put either one, he was stuck. He had to hire me to turn it back into a garage."

The decision to do a project yourself or to hire a contractor depends on the project's magnitude and your skill-level.

With basic skills, you can produce a great reorganization project. You can buy shelving, cabinets, pegs and hooks to turn your garage into useable space by yourself on a weekend. More ambitious projects could require a plumber, electrician or even a contractor.

Assess your skill level, time constraints and knowledge of codes and permits to decide if your project requires a professional. If you're planning to convert an attached garage into a living area yourself, you better be able to do a professional job or you risk decreasing the



value of your home—not to mention alienating your family.

If you opt for a contractor, get one whose work you've seen and preferably has been recommended.

Construction times and costs vary greatly with the scope of project. Contractor Saunders

says, "If there are no structural issues, enclosing and finishing an attached garage and converting it into a useable room would probably take less than two weeks."

Choosing a Garage Door Opener

Learn the three main types, their cost and how to install them

If opening your garage door is a pain in the back, it's time to consider installing an automatic garage door opener. No longer considered a convenience item for the privileged, today's garage door openers are affordable, safe and easy to install.

There are three main types of openers:

Chain drive mechanism: By far the most popular and affordable opening device.

Priced between \$100 and \$170, this model uses a chain to move the door.

Screw drive mechanism: This slow-moving design relies on a long threaded bar to open the door. The cost for this unit is typically between \$150 and \$200.

Belt drive mechanism: Considered the quietest and, priced at \$200 and up, the most expensive opening device. This design uses rubber belts to open the door.

The latest garage door opener safety features include automatic reversing action sensors and infrared beams to stop the garage door's downward movement should something get in the way. To keep thieves from stealing your transmission code, many openers feature technology that sends a different signal each time you use the opener.

Installation tips

To install your garage door opener quickly and easily, follow these simple tips:

- 1. Secure the rail to the garage wall above the center of the door.
- **2.** Use the supplied mounting straps to attach the unit motor to the garage framing overhead. Be sure it's centered between the garage door tracks.
- 3. Secure the opener's connecting arm to a bracket attached to the door.
- 4. Run wires from the unit motor to the wall-mounted control switch.
- **5.** Plug motor into the nearest outlet.

Keep in mind that installation instructions can differ according to the type of opener you purchase. Extra features, such as infrared beams and keyless entry systems, require additional attention. For complete information, read the manufacturer's installation recommendations and instructions for your unit.
